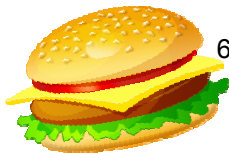

The Infrastructure Team:

'Delivering the WOW!'

The Infrastructure team have been working tirelessly for months to deliver the WOW. Here are a few facts to give you some idea of the work they have had to do:

- 2.5 kilometres of sewer pipe laid.
- 2.5 kilometres of communications cabling connecting all the sub camps, the medical centre etc...
- An additional 40 telephones installed
- 2 kilometres of electric cabling
- A network of 80 radios
- 0.5 kilometres of festoon lighting
- Install 3 generators – enough power to light a street of 20 houses
- We have an electronic plumbing alert system which works using the 2 kilometres of data cabling that's been installed and tells us if there's a problem....
